WORSHIP ASSISTANTS

- O Acolytes—3rd through 8th graders who are trained to assist during worship by lighting and extinguishing the altar candles and carrying the cross.
- O <u>Altar Care Volunteers</u>—Trained individuals who attend to the altar and prepare for communion & baptisms.
- O <u>Greeters</u>—Greet all worshippers as they enter the church and direct visitors to the Welcome Center.
- O Readers—Read the scripture lessons during the services.
- O <u>Ushers</u>—Assist people in finding a seat, count and record the attendance, release rows for communion and assist in straightening up the sanctuary after services.
- O <u>Welcome Center Host</u>—Welcome all worshippers to Bethel. Answer questions, provide general information, room directions, and usher visitors to the sanctuary. Distribute visitor bags and gifts.

WORSHIP SUPPORT

- O <u>Altar Care Bread Bakers</u>—Bake and bring communion bread to the church on a rotating basis. (The bread recipe is provided.)
- O <u>Audio Operators</u>—Operate the audio systems for services, concerts, and dramas, as needed.
- O <u>Bethel Adult Choir</u>—Sing weekly from September to the end of May and other special services. Rehearsals are held on Thursdays at 6:30pm.
- O Cantors—Lead the congregation in singing the liturgy during traditional services.
- O <u>Drama Group</u>—Help with large-scale dramas performed throughout the year especially around Holy Week (For example—Passion Play, Last Supper Drama).
- O <u>Jacob's Ladder Worship Team</u>—For singers & instrumentalists aged 16 and up, lead the congregation in musical worship during the contemporary service. Audition required.
- O <u>Video Operators</u>—Operate the video computer and the broadcast/streaming systems during weekly and other services, as needed.

- O <u>Fostering Hope</u>—Be part of a team that supports local foster families.
- O <u>Habitat for Humanity / Faith Builds</u>—Work on homes in the Colorado Springs area.
- Outreach Leadership Team—Join the leadership team and help manage Bethel's stewardship funds. Attend monthly meetings and update the group on the programs and needs that we support.

- O <u>LFS Backpack and School Supply Drive</u>—Collect and deliver school supplies for Lutheran Family Services annual drive.
- O <u>LFS Foster Care and Safe Care Angel Trees</u>—Collect gifts for needy foster care and safe care children.

TECHNOLOGY TEAM

- O <u>Audio Systems</u> Configure, manage, and operate audio systems to include sanctuary, assisted listening, and classroom areas.
- O <u>Video Systems</u> Configure, manage, and operate video systems to include sanctuary, streaming, and classroom areas.
- O <u>Lighting Systems</u> Configure, manage, and operate lighting systems in the sanctuary for Bethel's drama productions.
- O <u>Office Automation</u> Manage, in conjunction with our vendors, Bethel's computer, printer, and other office automation systems.
- O <u>Collaboration Services</u> Manage the video and audio conferencing systems; coordinate support for team needs and assist teams in scheduling.
- O <u>Display Systems</u> Manage the creation and activation of content for the narthex display systems.
- O <u>Network Management</u> Configure, manage, and monitor wired and wireless network services as well as Bethel's connection to the internet.
- O <u>Social Media Services</u> Manage and sustain social media content such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, etc.
- O <u>Web Services</u> Manage and sustain various web services such as Membership (e.g., CCB), Media production, Office subscriptions, etc.

- O <u>Bible Study Leader</u>—Help lead or facilitate a Bible Study small group that meets during the week or a class on Sunday mornings.
- O <u>Lay Ministry Group</u>—Take communion to homebound or shut-in members.

- Youth Mentor—Develop a relationship with youth and their parents. Support the youth and parents by praying for them regularly, accompanying the youth for church activities and events, and supporting the youth at their extracurricular school events.
- O <u>Youth Ministry Adult Leader</u>—Assists the Youth Minister by engaging the youth in conversations during youth gatherings.
- O <u>Youth Ministry Intercessors</u>—Pray daily/weekly for the people and ministry efforts of Bethel's youth.
- Youth Ministry Partners—Help formulate strategies to meet the goals of the Youth Ministry Team, and support the implementation of action steps (open to all members of the congregation regardless of family status).
- O <u>Youth Sunday School Teacher</u>—Engages middle and high school youth in conversations centered around the Bible during the Sunday School hour.
